

About Us

Calgary Youth Justice Society builds positive connections between young people and their communities through strength-based programs that focus on what's strong, not what's wrong. We believe that every young person matters. Our impact is young people who feel valued, supported, and meaningfully connected to their community.

Our Programs



In the Lead

In the Lead (ITL) is a strength-based leadership program where young people recognize their potential and build confidence in who they are. ITL empowers participants to see, use, and believe in their strengths. Through reflection, real-world leadership opportunities, and support from caring volunteers, young people in the program develop key skills that increase resilience. Participants leave the program with a renewed belief in themselves, their abilities, and a sense of belonging.

In the Lead 180

In the Lead 180 is a character and leadership development program designed for youth involved in the justice system. The objective is to build and enhance key protective factors that are known to reduce risk taking behavior and re-offending.





In the Lead Next Gen

In the Lead Next Gen was launched in 2024 and is a strength-based advanced leadership program for young adults who have completed ITL and want to continue their leadership journey. This program helps young adults maximize their unique strengths, take their leadership skills to the next level, and deepen their self-awareness.

Calgary Youth Justice Committees

A community-based alternative to court that gives young people a second chance on a bad decision. CYJC volunteers help young people move through and past a minor offence by holding them accountable without holding them back. With support, young people from all walks of life turn their mistakes into opportunities to grow and give back to their communities.



Our Mission

Through the power of restorative and strength-based practices Calgary Youth Justice Society inspires young people to realize their potential, build meaningful relationships and positively engage with their communities.

Message from The President and Executive Director

"In 2024, we proudly completed our 5-year strategic plan at the Calgary Youth Justice Society, marking a significant milestone for the organization. The focus of the 2020-2024 plan was to build a solid foundation for future growth, while also significantly expanding our reach.

We are pleased to share that we met and exceeded every one of our ambitious goals including our aim to double the number of youths served and to double the organizational budget. We closed out the year having served 817 young people, surpassing our yearly goal of 800 that we set back in 2019. Virtually every area of the organization has grown, including our team which has also doubled from 9 to 18 staff members. A highlight during this period was our geographic expansion to support young people through our In the Lead 180 program and Youth Justice Committees across Alberta.

We are immensely proud of the entire CYJS team, including our dedicated staff and volunteers. Their unwavering focus and commitment to our mission and vision are the driving forces behind CYJS's success. Not even a global pandemic could stand in the way of the team consistently exceeding every goal that was set. And as a team we are grateful for each and every stakeholder, community partner, and generous supporter that empowered us to exceed our goals. The support of our community is fueling our team as we move forward. We are confident that the last 5 years of work have prepared the organization to embark on the next level of transformation.

In 2024, we undertook the development of a new 5-year strategic plan. The process was led by Parsons Dialogue and supported by Alberta Law Foundation. Thank you to our Board members, staff, stakeholders, funders, partners, and youth who informed our path ahead through surveys, interviews, focus groups, and meetings. We envisioned a future for CYJS, supported by three strategic directions: Flourishing Youth, Thriving Organization, and Growing our Reach. We are eagerly looking ahead to the next five years as we continue to build opportunities for all young people to realize their potential.

Thank you for the continued financial support for In the Lead from founding partner Cenovus Energy, as well as FCSS, RBC, Rogers Charity Classic, City of Calgary Crime Prevention Investment Plan, Calgary Foundation, and The Ministry of Public Safety and Emergency Services. 2020 - 2024 Strategic Plan: **Goals & Successes**

Grow our impact amongst vulnerable youth in Calgary

We achieved the goal of doubling the number of youth served from 409 to 820:

- From pilot to regular In the Lead (ITL) 180 programming
- ITL program delivery expansion and diversification to include grade 9, indigenous, 2SLGBTQIA+, youth in custody, and 18-24 year olds
- Increased referrals to Youth Justice Committees (YJC) through a strong partnership with Calgary Police Service and justice stakeholders
- YJC community development to increase youth access to services and supports

Grow revenue, profile and community of support

- Double our budget by 2024. We exceeded that goal with an increase of 125%!
- Dedicated resources and capacity to increase public presence through community events, communication channels, and conference participation
- Diversification of revenue through a fund development strategy to increase in corporate, government and individual supporters

Strengthen organizational infrastructure to support growth

We exceeded our goal from exploring to delivering Provincial programming:

- ITL 180 is offered to young people across Alberta
- Expanded our support to YJCs and law enforcement across Alberta

Our staff team grew from 9 people to 18, including 7 new positions

Strengthened resources to support program operations:

- File and volunteer management databases
- Evaluation resources and tools

Strengthened Board capacity by:

- Development of Board Committees
- · Diversifying skills and experience of board members

Looking Ahead: 2025 - 2029 Strategic Plan

In June of 2024, CYJS embarked on the journey of creating a new 5-year Strategic Plan. We engaged our community of young people, partners, volunteers, and investors, receiving their input on various aspects of our organization. We also invited our board and staff members to participate in strategy planning workshops. As a result of these conversations, we observed the importance of remaining true to our core values and plan on growing our reach to include a more diverse range of communities and clients. We are so excited to highlight some of our goals that resulted from these conversations and workshops:



Flourishing Youth - providing impactful and innovative programming

- Proactively evolve and build programming to meet emerging youth needs
- Amplify our volunteer engagement
- Build and sustain collaborative program partnerships



Thriving Organization - ensuring organizational sustainability and excellence

- Enhance our team, culture, and capacity
- Advance a high-performance Board of Directors to steward a growing organization



Growing our Reach - engaging agency champions, promoting best practices, and expanding our geographical presence

- Broaden and retain our base of funders, donors, and supporters
- Share our strength-based and restorative approaches working with youth
- Continue our geographical expansion in Alberta

One of the best parts about volunteering is witnessing the growth and success of the youth throughout the program. I am grateful to witness them complete their sanctions or growth plan in a thoughtful, engaged, and personal way. To hear their experience of the program and how it was not as scary as they thought!

Youth have shared they feel heard and respected. They are empowered to have a voice, to build upon their strengths and given opportunities to learn new skills or be connected to community resources to assist them in making better choices moving forward.

My situation while growing up was challenging. I grew up in an immigrant household, faced poverty, and did what I could to 'fit in' with others. This resulted in me hanging out with the wrong crowd and finding myself in trouble. I felt cornered and stuck, but knew that I wanted to do well in life.


Since beginning the programs at CYJS, I am no longer involved with the wrong crowd. I am starting fresh as a university student, a public speaker for Gloves Not Guns (a youth boxing program that empowers young people to overcome life's obstacles), and am helping others through speaking, consulting, and training. I was able to beat the cycle of poverty and pain, and am the first child in my family to attend post-secondary.

For a lot of my life, I felt like a bird in a cage. Because of different non-profit organizations, one of which being CYJS, I was able to find my wings again and fly, and now I am doing more than I ever thought I could.

Our Impact in 2024


Our programming is grounded in three core principles that guide everything we do: a relentless pursuit of strengths, meaningful relationships, and a positive connection to community. These principles form the foundation of our work, shape our approach, and result in **three key pillars of impact**:

- 1 Connection to a strengths-based worldview
- 2 Connection between young people and positive supports
- 3 Connection with community



Connection to a strengths-based worldview

We aim to inspire young people and their supporters to focus on strengths and possibility, helping them recognize and use their own strengths - and those of others - to thrive.

91% of ITL Young Leaders further developed a growth mindset; believing in their ability to improve on their strengths and abilities through hard work.

"In the Lead has made me more eager to work to be the best person I can. So that I can be a good leader to whoever I take care of, so that I can lead by example."

94% of ITL Volunteer Coaches agreed that through their experience with ITL, they more consciously seek to see the strengths in themselves and others.

"My takeaway is seeing strengths in any situation and increasing the toolbox of methods to face challenges in any form they may come."

91% of youth participating in the YJC Program successfully developed strengths and skills setting them on a positive path forward.

Connection between young people and positive supports

We create intentional opportunities for young people to develop meaningful relationships with agency volunteers and other supports, creating opportunities for learning, inspiration, and development.

98% of ITL Young Leaders strengthened intrapersonal strengths, supporting their ability to have positive interactions with others and successfully manage relationships.

92% of ITL Volunteer Coaches agreed participating in the program helped them develop new ways to connect and communicate with others.

Connection with community

Our programming creates its own exclusive community for young people while also creating opportunities for young people to positive engage with and contribute to their own communities.

95% of ITL 180 Participants said that because of the program, they believe they can be a positive influence in the world.
